From Rev. John Calhoun, United Methodist missionary in Kyiv, Ukraine October 31, 2018

Dearest friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ! I pray that you and your loved ones are well and blessed.

Like many missionaries sent out by Global Ministries, the mission agency of the United Methodist Church, I am the only missionary from our church serving in Ukraine. Although I enjoy the support of many in my community—my family, good friends, colleagues in local ministry—I miss the companionship of fellow missionaries who are similarly called and sent by our church into mission.

Thus it was a great blessing for me to travel to Berlin earlier this month and participate in a gathering of Global Ministries missionaries serving in Europe, Eurasia, and the Middle East. Twenty missionaries, from Northern Ireland to Kazakhstan, from Oslo to Bethlehem, met in the German capital for a week of fellowship, worship, refreshment, and revitalization. Throughout each day, missionaries and their family members gathered for Bible study and prayer, presentations on mission, small group discussion on a variety of topics, and warm fellowship over shared meals. We also



celebrated worship with a local United Methodist congregation, and explored important historical and cultural landmarks of the city, such as the Berlin Wall and the Holocaust Memorial. I was honored to be part of the leadership team of this event, and also to lead a discussion group on the importance of embracing migrants to our local communities.



This week of fellowship reminded me of what a privilege it is to serve as a missionary, and inspired within me a renewed commitment to mission service. As I shared my own struggles and frustrations, I took comfort and strength from the prayerful support I received from my mission colleagues. What a blessing it is to gather with those who share my vocation.

Coincidentally, while I was in Berlin, several African students from our international ministry in Kyiv enjoyed a similar blessing of inspired fellowship with their peers. These students

traveled to the nearby city of Vinnitsa to take part in the International Christian Medical Conference. This annual event brings Christian medical students from across Ukraine together for several days of lectures, workshops, and devotional events, creating a network of support and care for Ukrainian and international students who see their medical studies as a part of their Christian vocation.

During our weekly Bible study last Sunday, our young adults shared their appreciation for the opportunity to gather with other Christian medical students, and to be strengthened by the faith witness of their new friends. They also expressed their gratitude to the many supporters of our international ministry in Kyiv; thanks to financial donations to the ministry, we were able to cover the cost of our students to travel to and participate in this powerful event. So, on behalf of the students of the international ministry of the UMC in Kyiv, I thank you for your support!
